Students in Transition



Sometimes a student in a homeless situation will enroll in a new school, because the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth was not informed of the student's right to remain in the school of origin. In that case, does the student still have the right to go back to the school of origin?

Did You Know? While public schools are required to provide transportation to school, in many circumstances lack of transportation still can contribute to absenteeism for students experiencing homelessness. For example, lack of timely transportation to medical appointments or jobs can result in students missing partial or full days of school. Rural communities in particular must leverage their strengths and work as a team to support transportation needs. OCS D is fortunate to have donations from ADK-Retired Teachers. Donations are used to pay for Ubers and cab fares to transport Title IX students and families to school appointments and in emergencies home to school.

Yes. If parents or youth are not informed of their rights, then the LEA must enroll the student in the original school of origin, consistent with the request of the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth. The LEA is required to inform families of their right. A parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth not knowing their rights does not change their entitlement to them under the law.
